2. POSTDOCTORAL TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES

(1) APA/IES Postdoctoral Education Research Training Fellowship Awards are designed to match postdoctoral fellows with established mentors to pursue research training related to teaching and learning in preK – 12 settings.

3. FUNDING ANNOUNCED FOR CDC PREVENTION RESEARCH CENTERS (PRC)

The PRCs are required to have a core research project that is community-based and participatory, with a major focus on design, testing, and dissemination of effective prevention research strategies. Applications may be submitted by schools of public health, schools of medicine or osteopathy with an accredited Preventive Medicine Residency. It is expected that the average award will be approximately \$750,000 to \$850,000 per center.

- (3) Longitudinal studies that identify risk and protective factors in early childhood, explain the mechanisms of action over time.

Submission Deadline: February 1, 2004. Publication of the special issue is scheduled for October 2004.
