1. NIAAA's ALCOHOL POLICY INFORMATION SYSTEM (APIS) WEBSITE

Alcohol Policy Information System (APIS), a project of the National Institute on Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism (NIAAA), has recently added detailed information on seven new policy topics, including extensive coverage of laws pertaining to UNDERAGE DRINKING AND ACCESS TO ALCOHOL. The current update brings the number of policy topics covered by APIS to 29, encompassing such diverse areas as alcohol control systems, taxes on alcohol beverages, BAC limits, alcohol consumption by pregnant women, and limitations on insurers' liability for losses due to intoxication. The goal of the APIS project is to encourage and facilitate research on the effects and effectiveness of alcohol-related public policies in the United States.
